The Tree of Life

You most likely have already noticed our Tree of Life in the Gathering Space of Church. This tree is a recognition device that will serve as a lasting remembrance to the generosity and the caring support of our parishioners. Donors can choose exactly what is to be inscribed on the leaf/rock. Because all of us have different levels of material blessings, the virtue of the tree is it welcomes donors at many levels. It is our hope that each and every parish family will be represented here on the tree. The tree will be a lasting tribute to our efforts to sustain and prosper our beloved Saint John Neumann Parish. Please review these common questions/answers below:

Q: What level of gift is necessary to be recognized with a leaf or rock?

A: There are six levels; A large rock is at the \$50,000 pledge level while the medium rock is available at the \$25,000 level, and the small rock at \$10,000. A leaf inscribed with two stars is available at the \$5,000 pledge level, while a one-star leaf is at the \$3,600 level. You can also get a leaf by itself with a pledge of \$2,000.

Q: Why would my family want a leaf/rock on the Tree of Life?

A: A leaf or a rock is an everlasting way to remember a loved one. You can also share your pride in your parish, celebrate an important or momentous event such as the birth of a child or grandchild, an anniversary or marriage or simply convey a message that you want to share with fellow parishioners and guests.

Q: When do I submit my personal inscription for engraving?

A: Once your pledge is submitted you will receive a thank you letter from Father Sizemore; that letter will also include an inscription form that you simply fill out. You can then get that inscription back to us, either by dropping in the collection or delivering to the parish office using the enclosed envelope. The inscription will then be sent for engraving and emplaced within a few weeks.

Q: Do we need to pay the pledge in full before receiving our inscription?

A: No! Requiring such a thing would be conveying a lack of trust; this is certainly not the response we desire in a parish family. We want to see everyone's leaf or rock go up onto the tree as quickly as possible.
